From the CATECHISM of the CATHOLIC CHURCH

“It is in the Church that Christ fulfils and reveals his own mystery as the purpose of God’s plan: ‘to unite all things in him.’ St. Paul calls the nuptial union of Christ and the Church ‘a great mystery.’ Because she is united to Christ as to her bridegroom she becomes a mystery in her turn. Contemplating this mystery in her, Paul exclaims: ‘Christ in you, the hope of glory.’” (CCC, 772)

Gospel Reflection from a Parishioner
Holy Gospel of Mark 6: 7 - 13

What kind of authority and power does the Lord want us to exercise on his behalf? Jesus gave his apostles both the power and the authority to speak and to act in his name. He commanded them to do the works which he did -- to cast out evil spirits, to heal, and to speak the word of God. When Jesus spoke of power and authority he did something unheard of. He wedded power and authority with love and humility.

Why does Jesus tell the apostles to "travel light" with little or no provision? "Poverty of spirit" frees us from greed and preoccupation with possessions and makes ample room for God's provision. The Lord wants his disciples to be dependent on him and not themselves. Are you ready to handle the power and authority which God wishes you to exercise on his behalf? Are you eager to place yourself at his service, to do whatever he bids you, and to witness his truth and saving power to whomever he sends you?
