From the Catechism of the Catholic Church

Jesus asks for childlike abandonment to the providence of our heavenly Father who takes care of his children's smallest needs: "Therefore do not be anxious, saying, "What shall we eat?" or "What shall we drink?"... Your heavenly Father knows that you need them all. But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things shall be yours as well." (CCC, 305)

GOSPEL REFLECTION (MATTHEW 13: 1-9)

The thirteenth chapter of Matthew's Gospel consists of seven parables and some interpretations. The parables centre on Kingdom of God and the various human responses to this kingdom and its message. The parables were interpreted most likely during the composition of the gospels. Jesus spoke in parables to arrest the attention of his hearers and to tease them into active thought. No wonder we read of the common refrain: "He who has ears to hear, let him hear", in two of the parables (Matt. 13:9, 43). This refrain is an invitation to the listener to think reflectively on the human application of the parables.

In the Parable of the Sower, the emphasis falls on the condition of the soil and its effects on the seed. The kinds of soil depict different responses to Jesus' words. The resistant response is the seed that falls along the path. Since the ground is hard, the seed cannot penetrate the surface and is soon devoured by the birds.

The shallow response is the seed that falls on patches of rock. The seeds sprout quickly but since there is no deeper soil for the plant to sink its roots, it withers under the heat of the Sun. this describes nominal disciples.

The distracted response is the seed that falls among thorns. Here, the soil is sufficiently deep but another problem arises; it is already occupied by weeds powerful enough to choke the new feeble plant. The thorns illustrate the power of money and earthly possessions to prevent undivided loyalty to Christ.

The productive response is the seed that falls on good unencumbered soil. Amidst the loss, there is an abundant harvest; despite all obstacles the message of the kingdom achieves its purpose. The good soil alone shows what it means to be a true disciple of Jesus, the way one lives one's life shows how one has really understood and received the message of the kingdom. What is our response to God's word?
