From the CATECHISM of the CATHOLIC CHURCH

REFLECTION

PRAYER – It is not just a function in life, not even the most important function, rather it is LIFE itself. "We are truly alive, truly human only when our whole life is prayer".

The Holy Eucharist is the greatest prayer of the Church. It is the climax on earth of God's search for us and our search for God, beginning with interior prayer and leading to exterior Sacrifice. Our personal prayers and sacrifices are incomplete without Christ Jesus; hence the absolute necessity of perseverance in prayer through our total participation in the Eucharistic celebration.

Today's readings give us the occasion to reflect on prayer. Prayer is an essential part of the life of the disciple of Christ. It is about living in trust with God, which is why perseverance has a prominent place in the readings.

Prayer is necessary to ADORE, THANK, IMPLORE PARDON and PETITION God. "Only the fool ignores God. Wisdom recognises God, worships His infinite excellence and acknowledges our absolute dependence on Him, and all this is prayer.

To ADORE God is the first commandment, since as Creator and Preserver of all things, He is supreme.

To THANK God for all the gifts of nature that you have received as His creatures; for all the gifts of grace that you have received as His Children.

To IMPLORE PARDON from God, because sin is the evil responsible for all temporal and eternal punishment

To PETITION God for His graces and blessings, because not to ask is either to ignore or reject them."
