Gospel Reflection from a Parishioner

Holy Gospel of Mark 9: 30 - 37

Jesus and his disciples came to Capernaum, He began to ask them "What were you arguing about on the way?" They remained silent. They had been discussing among themselves on the way who was the greatest

Jesus uses the model of a little child to illustrate his point. Children are innocent and without pretensions. They embody what "least of all" means. This also illustrates to what extent the disciple is to become the "servant of all" by receiving even the "least of all". The total self-emptying that enables one to receive the "least of all" describes the disciple. This is how we receive Jesus - by receiving the least. No one is insignificant.

In the Gospel of today Jesus invites us as he called his disciples to understand his person and mission.

Through all his life, through everything that constitutes the very essence of his person, Jesus is the Christ, the one whom God chose to bring to the world the life - giving Spirit, the Spirit who is Lord and who gives Life, as we say in the Creed. As son of God he would live forever and give life to the world.
