From the Parish Priest

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Let us greatly rejoice in the Lord for, "At the end of time, the Kingdom of God will come in its fullness. After the universal judgement, the righteous will reign for ever with Christ, glorified in body and soul. The universe itself will be renewed: The Church ... will receive her perfection only in the glory of heaven, when will come the time of the renewal of all things. At that time, together with the human race, the universe itself, which is so closely related to man and which attains its destiny through him, will be perfectly re-established in Christ." (CCC, 1042)

Beloved in today's parable we are all invited to the wedding feast of the Lamb, but we must put on the appropriate garment, that is, the 'Garment of Salvation' in order to remain in the presence of God and enjoy his Holy banquet.

As chosen people of God, holy and beloved we must put on a heart of compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience... and beyond all these put on Love which is the perfect bond of unity. The cloth of righteousness and of Love which the Lord freely gives us in Christ Jesus will increase our affection first and foremost for God, which will allow us to share His Love with others.

Let us 'strip' ourselves of our old garment of self-righteousness which are like 'filthy rags' in God's sight, and put on the bridal garment of righteousness and love, for with the Spirit of Humility and modesty we will bear the fruit of meekness and teachable spirit capable of changing us into the very image of Christ so that the Lord will see in us "bone of His bone, and flesh of His flesh".

Therefore with the prophet Isaiah we can say "I will greatly rejoice in the Lord, my soul shall exult in my God; for he has clothed me with the garments of Salvation, he has covered me with the robe of righteousness, as a bridegroom decks himself with a garland, and as a bride adorns herself with her jewels." (61:10)

Remain in God's love and care!

Jesus' parable in today's Gospel is an outline of Salvation history.

God is King, Jesus the bridegroom, the feast is Salvation and eternal life. The Israelites are those first invited. For refusing repeated invitations and killing His prophets, Israel has been punished, its city conquered by foreign armies.

God has sent new servants, His apostles, to call not only Israelites, but all people - good and bad alike - to the feast of His Kingdom.

But are we dressed for the feast, clothed in the garments of righteousness?

Not all who have been called will be chosen for eternal life, let us be sure that we are living in a manner worthy of the invitation we have received.
