From the CATECHISM of the CATHOLIC CHURCH

"Thanksgiving characterizes the prayer of the Church which, in celebrating the Eucharist, reveals and becomes more fully what she is. Indeed, in the work of salvation, Christ sets creation free from sin and death to consecrate it anew and make it return to the Father, for his glory. The thanksgiving of the members of the Body participates in that of their Head." (CCC, 2637)

GOSPEL REFLECTION (Luke 17: 11-19)

Jesus makes clear how important it is to give thanks to God in today's Gospel. He was astounded and somewhat hurt that only one of the ten cured lepers returned to give thanks to God.

Thanksgiving is absolutely central to the life of a Christian. Without a spirit of thanksgiving, our Christian lives would be cold and stale. An attitude of thankfulness preserves the right relationship with God. If we are thankful, God is necessarily part of our lives. It is difficult to see how we could turn away from God permanently and irrevocably if we preserve an attitude of thankfulness. Even if we have serious sins we find it difficult to overcome, we will not be permanently separated from God if we can still acknowledge the Lord's love and goodness and thank him for it. To be thankful is to see reality clearly.

The Holy Mass is about thanksgiving. Before all else we are saying "thank you". That is what the word "Eucharist" means. The meaning of the mass is summed up in the dialogue before the Preface when we say, "It is right to give him thanks and praise". Every Preface begins with the following or similar words: "Father, it is our duty and our salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks through your beloved Son, Jesus Christ".

It is always important to come to mass in a spirit of thankfulness. What we do in every mass is to say, "Thank You Lord".
