From the CATECHISM of the CATHOLIC CHURCH

"The first movement of the prayer of petition is *asking forgiveness*, like the tax collector in the parable: "God, be merciful to me a sinner!" It is a prerequisite for righteous and pure prayer. A trusting humility brings us back into the light of communion between the Father and his Son Jesus Christ and with one another, so that "we receive from him whatever we ask." Asking forgiveness is the prerequisite for both the Eucharistic liturgy and personal prayer." (CCC, 2631)

GOSPEL REFLECTION (Luke 18: 9-14)

The story of the Pharisee and the tax collector invites us to examine our relationship with people that we classify as sinners. The Pharisees were serious minded believers who committed themselves to a regular life of prayer and observance of God's law. They tended to love only "good" respectable people like themselves and generally looked down with contempt on sinners like tax collectors, who were regarded as people of low moral standards. Since the tax collectors worked for the Romans, mixed with them and constantly handled their unclean money, they were considered as people in a state of ritual uncleanness.

The tax collector stays on the edge of the Temple court. In contrast to the proud Pharisee, the tax collector does not even lift his hands or his eyes to heaven. He beats his chest instead, a sign of deep contrition and cries out to God in despair, overwhelmed by his sins. Unexpectedly, it is not the devout Pharisee, but the penitent tax collector who is commended. The Lord accepts his sacrifice of a broken and a contrite heart.

The Pharisees believed in a God who was quick to judge and condemn anyone who fell outside the norms of what they considered acceptable behaviour, and so they themselves were quick to condemn. Jesus, however, teaches that those who arrogantly trust in themselves and despise others reject God, no matter how many their religious activities, or how worthy they may outwardly appear to be.

"There are three attitudes toward giving: grudge giving, duty giving and thanksgiving. Grudge giving says 'I hate to'; duty giving says 'I ought to'; thanksgiving says, 'I want to'.
