From the CATECHISM of the CATHOLIC CHURCH

"Far from diminishing our concern to develop this earth, the expectancy of a new earth should spur us on, for it is here that the body of a new human family grows, foreshadowing in some way the age which is to come. That is why, although we must be careful to distinguish earthly progress clearly from the increase of the kingdom of Christ, such progress is of vital concern to the kingdom of God, insofar as it can contribute to the better ordering of human society." GOSPEL REFLECTION (LUKE 21: 5-19)

Today Jesus speaks to us about wisdom and witness. The destruction of Jerusalem will bring in its wake wars, famines and earthquakes. Followers of Jesus will be persecuted and even put to death. However, this crisis will be an opportunity to bear witness to the wisdom and love of God. The Spirit of the Lord, living in us, will give us all the eloquence that we need to witness to God. This eloquence does not have to take the form of words. It is the witness of a simple life that speaks more powerfully than any words can ever do. We are to persevere in goodness and holiness of life and trust absolutely in the care of the Lord.

In his own life, Jesus faced hostility from all sides, Jews and Romans. Yet he had a wisdom and an eloquence that none of his enemies could resist or contradict. It is this example that we are called to follow to win our lives.
