From the Parish Priest

Dear Brothers and Sisters

May the Joy of the Resurrection remain with us!

"By means of touch and the sharing of a meal, the risen Jesus establishes direct contact with his disciples. He invites them in this way to recognize that he is not a ghost and above all to verify that the risen body in which he appears to them is the same body that had been tortured and crucified, for it still bears the traces of his passion. Yet at the same time this authentic, real body possesses the new properties of a glorious body: not limited by space and time but able to be present how and when he wills; for Christ's humanity can no longer be confined to earth, and belongs henceforth only to the Father's divine realm. For this reason too the risen Jesus enjoys the sovereign freedom of appearing as he wishes: in the guise of a gardener or in other forms familiar to his disciples, precisely to awaken their faith." (ccc 645)

Dearly beloved, when our hopes are shattered and our spirits downcast by the daily challenges of life, we are not alone, for the risen Lord is ever close to lift us up. Through the study of or reflection on Divine Revelation (Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition) and participation in the Breaking of Bread (Holy Eucharist) we come to encounter the risen Lord who enlivens our souls with renewed hope, and fills us with gladness with His presence.

May we open the doors of our hearts to the Lord as He shares His Word and Sacraments with us in our lives journey, and also by the power of the Holy Spirit, may we be given courage to be true and faithful witnesses of His resurrection in the 'Body of Christ'- the Church

Stay blessed and remain in the path of life shown by the paschal mystery of the Lord!

Gospel Reflection from a Parishioner

The Holy Gospel of Luke 24: 13-35

On the road to Emmaus Jesus joins the two disciples along the slow journey to wisdom. He led them along a similar journey to the stage where they understood what was happening in their lives, "God suddenly unexpectedly sent His Son to walk with them".

This story of the road to Emmaus, and how they recognised him at the "breaking of the bread", teaches us about the Eucharist, and in particular the way in which it provides food for eternal life.

The love and generosity of Jesus responding to the confusion of the two disciples, teaching them the fuller meaning of his actions, and His own total self-giving for others at the Last Supper, and his suffering and death.
