From the CATECHISM of the CATHOLIC CHURCH

"The Law of the Gospel *fulfills the commandments* of the Law. The Lord's Sermon on the Mount, far from abolishing or devaluing the moral prescriptions of the Old Law, releases their hidden potential and has new demands arise from them: it reveals their entire divine and human truth. It does not add new external precepts, but proceeds to reform the heart, the root of human acts, where man chooses between the pure and the impure, where faith, hope, and charity are formed and with them the other virtues. The Gospel thus brings the Law to its fullness through imitation of the perfection of the heavenly Father, through forgiveness of enemies and prayer for persecutors, in emulation of the divine generosity." (CCC, 1968)

GOSPEL REFLECTION (MATTHEW 5: 17-37)

Jesus Christ gives a new dimension to the law of loving one's neighbour by extending it to loving one's enemy. The Israelites were accustomed to loving one's neighbour; "You must love your neighbour as yourself" (c.f. Lev. 19:18). The novelty in Jesus' law is loving someone who hates or opposes you. It is only in loving our enemies and praying for those who persecute us that we show that we are true sons and daughters of God. Even in his agony on the cross, Jesus gathers courage and strength to pray and ask for forgiveness for those killing him.

A civil rights leader who strove to follow this commandment of loving one's neighbour comments: "I am not speaking of love in a sentimental or affectionate sense. It would be nonsense to urge people to love their oppressors in an affectionate sense. When I refer to love in this context, I mean understanding goodwill (goodness) — we must in strength and humility meet hate with love". Hate cannot conquer hate. Love, and only love triumphs over hate.
