From the Catechism of the Catholic Church

"The disciple of Christ must not only keep the faith and live on it, but also profess it, confidently bear witness to it, and spread it: "All however must be prepared to confess Christ before men and to follow him along the way of the Cross, amidst the persecutions which the Church never lacks." Service of and witness to the faith are necessary for salvation: "So everyone who acknowledges me before men, I also will acknowledge before my Father who is in heaven; but whoever denies me before men, I also will deny before my Father who is in heaven." (CCC, 1816)

GOSPEL REFLECTION (John 20: 19-31)

Jesus Christ repeatedly revealed himself to his disciples after his resurrection to drive home the fact that he was alive. Since he was no longer constrained by space and time, he was able to stand among his disciples although they had closed the doors of the house in which they stayed. He gave them the promised gift of peace, the kind of peace that the world cannot give. This peace simply means total wellbeing or wholeness. Surely, it is only Jesus Christ who gives total wellbeing.

He then commissioned his disciples and gave them the Holy Spirit to forgive sins. The Sacrament of Reconciliation has its roots in this text as well as Christ's authority to Peter to bind and loose (c.f Matt. 16:19; 18:8). One potent way of experiencing the fountain of Christ's mercy is through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Through this sacrament, Christ restores us to his friendship and to the life of grace. We should not doubt the efficacy of this sacrament like Thomas wanting to put his finger into the holes of Christ's side. We should rather approach this sacrament with awe, humility and a contrite heart as Thomas exclaimed, "My Lord and my God!" The gospel accounts have been recorded so that we may come to believe in Jesus Christ or continue to grow in faith. "Jesus, we trust in thee!"
