From the CATECHISM of the CATHOLIC CHURCH

"St. Gregory of Nazianzus, also called 'the Theologian,' entrusts this summary of Trinitarian faith to the catechumens of Constantinople: "Above all guard for me this great deposit of faith for which I live and fight, which I want to take with me as a companion, and which makes me bear all evils and despise all pleasures: I mean the profession of faith in the Father and Son and Holy Spirit. I entrust it to you today. By it I am soon going to plunge you into water and raise you up from it. I give it to you as the companion and patron of your whole life. I give you but one divinity and power, existing one in three, and containing the three in a distinct way. Divinity without disparity of substance or nature, without superior degree that raises up or inferior degree that casts down ... the infinite co-naturality of three infinites. Each person considered in himself is entirely God ... the three considered together ... I have not even begun to think of unity when the Trinity bathes me in its splendour. I have not even begun to think of the Trinity when unity grasps me. .." (CCC, 256)

Let us be aware of the presence of The Holy Trinity in our lives! At Baptism we became adopted 'Children of the Father'; 'co-heirs with Christ the Son' and Temples of The Holy Spirit.

All things good in nature and grace flow from and return to The Blessed Trinity; "from HIM" God the Father our creator; "through HIM" God the Son our Redeemer; "unto HIM" God The Holy Spirit, our Sanctifier.

To HIM be Glory for ever. Amen.

Gospel Reflection from a Parishioner

Gospel of Matthew 28:16-20

The good news we hear proclaimed on Trinity Sunday is that Jesus the Risen Lord wants us to share divine life with him in the oneness of intimate, familial love with his Father and the Holy Spirit. Through the gift of baptism we belong to God, and God belongs to us.

The Risen Lord, who conquered death, is with us as he promised. When we do not understand what is going on, when the demons in us and around us seem invincible, when we begin to sink in the stormy water, when the task in hand seems too much for us, Jesus stretches out his hand and says: "O you of little faith, why do

you doubt?" With our little faith, we can only respond: "Lord, I believe; help my unbelief".

The feast of the Most Holy Trinity is a mystery and a mystery is precisely something that one does not fully understand. Our faith tells us that these three persons are indeed distinct and yet together. The Father is at the origin of the Most Holy Trinity: he is its principle. The Father gives life to his Son: from all eternity.

Father and Son love each other with a love more complete and perfect than we can imagine. Their love is so perfect that it is a person, the Holy Spirit. The third person then is the personal love between Father and Son and is the bond of Union between the Father and the Son. Yet in our practice of faith there is no other words remembered than the names of Father, Son and the Spirit and this Trinity is needed for us to fully live our Christian life. In the doxology at the Eucharist we say, Through Him, with Him and in Him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honour is yours Almighty Father.
