REFLECTION

Passion Sunday or Palm Sunday begins the Holy Week celebrations, the most important week in the liturgical calendar. During this week, we recall the stages of Christ's passing from this world. It is a solemn passage through betrayal, denial, injustice and brutal suffering; a movement from death to resurrection taken together as one great event which brought salvation to the whole world.

All the four evangelists relate the narrative of the Christ's passion with little differences. Matthew, like Mark stresses that Jesus died to save the world. Jesus accomplishes his task with total obedience and humility to his Father. He focuses on his goal, the cross and the resurrection. Even as he enters Jerusalem like a King, he does not look at the excited crowd. He sees beyond all the noise and movements to what is ahead of him – crucifixion, death and resurrection. Let us accompany Jesus in his triumphant entry to Jerusalem not as spectators but actors in the drama of the passion.

How do we see ourselves? As hailing Jesus: "Hosanna to the Son of David" or crying out: "Crucify him". Are we Judas who betrayed him or Peter who denied him or one of the soldiers who mocked him or Pontius Pilate who sentenced the innocent to death? Whatever state we see ourselves, may we acknowledge that Jesus made this passionate Journey for you and for me.
