#### From the Parish Priest

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Leprosy in today's readings is used as a metaphor for Sin. Sin like leprosy is very contagious; it makes us spiritually unclean – sick in head; it isolates and corrupts us; it separates us from loved ones and the community; it makes us fragile and hopeless. Hence, sin separates us from the love of God.

"All men are called to the same end: God Himself. There is a certain resemblance between the unity of the divine persons and the fraternity that men are to establish among themselves in truth and love. Love of neighbour is inseparable from love of God." (CCC, 1878)

Beloved, Christ Jesus 'want to cure us', and by his touch he reconciles us with God and neighbour. In our days he does so through the Church by His Word and Sacraments. But for the sacraments to be effective we must have the right disposition - **Faith** (in Christ Jesus as our only refuge) and **Conversion of heart**. "If you want to, you can cure me" and hear him say "Of course I want to, be cured".

Dearly beloved, as we approach the sacraments of our redemption let us in Faith proclaim: 'Lord I am not worthy to receive you but only say the word and my soul shall be healed' believing that He who cured the leper through His death and resurrection will cure our sins and restore us to life with God and one another.

May Christ touch us in Love!

# Gospel Reflection from a Parishioner THE GOSPEL OF MARK 1: 40 - 45

THE GOSPEL OF WARK 1 . 40 - 45

There's more to the story in today's Gospel than a miraculous healing.

We live in a world of suffering: caused by diseases, and the exclusion of people. But rather than just say that is "the lot of humanity" we look towards Jesus as the one who brings healing, who welcomes people into his embrace, and who proclaims a new way of living. To belong to this community, is to recognise the mystery of God's forgiveness and healing made visible to us in Christ Jesus.

Martin was a young soldier in the Roman army. Elegantly dressed, he was mounted on his horse one day when he was accosted by a leper begging for alms. The sight and the stench of rotting flesh were so repulsive to the sensitivities of young Martin that his first instincts were to ride off on his horse. But something inside him made him walk up to the beggar. Since all he had was a military coat, he cut it in two and gave half to the leper while he wrapped himself in the other half. It was a very cold winter day. Many of the crowd thought this was so ridiculous a sight that they laughed and jeered but some realized that they were seeing Christian goodness. He was eighteen years old. That night in his dream he saw Christ clothed in a half coat saying to the angels around his throne "Martin clothed me with his garment." This was the turning point in the life of him who was to become St. Martin of Tours.
